Rogation Days

Anciently, the observation of the Rogation Days was connected, not with Morning and Evening Prayer (which were considered part of the celebration of the season of Easter), but with a votive celebration of the Eucharist introduced by a processional Litany. Where the custom can still be observed, the Great Litany is sung in procession, and concludes with the solemn chanting of Kyrie eleison. The Eucharist then begins (as described in the second rubric on page 406 of the Prayer Book) with the Salutation and Collect of the Rogation Mass. If the procession takes place out of doors, and the way is long, it is suitable to precede the Litany with hymns or other suitable chants, which may include Canticle 12 (Benedicite), Psalm 103 (Refrain: Bless the Lord, O my soul), and Psalm 104 (Refrain: Hallehujah!). The Litany is then sung as the procession enters the church.

Additional Psalms include Psalms 8, 22, 23, 37, 67, 68, 69, 72, 80, 122, 132, 145, and 146.

Where the full liturgy cannot be celebrated, it is appropriate to recite (or sing) the Litany as a separate devotion, concluding it with one of the Rogation Collects. Alternatively, or in addition, the Rogation Days may be observed at the Noonday Office in the following manner.
